RESOLUTION

SEWER USE REGULATION

WHEREFORE Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority has experienced a noticeable increase in the number of applications for sewer service involving privately owned pump stations and force mains within its service region; and,

WHEREFORE the multiplication of privately owned pump stations and force mains within WCRSA's service region complicates the administrative and enforcement burden on the Authority; and,

WHEREFORE WCRSA desires to leave the responsibility for the administration and maintenance of the satellite collector systems to the various sewer subdistricts, municipalities and counties which are authorized to provide retail sewer services within WCRSA's region so long as the policies of those respective entities do not impact WCRSA's operation and administration of the region's trunklines and wastewater treatment facilities; and,

WHEREFORE WCRSA has as yet been unable to reach agreement with several of the satellite sewer systems within the service region on the eradication of excess Infiltration and Inflow from the sewer system and therefore desires to provide a uniform standard against which adequate progress on individual work plans can be measured;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority Board that the attached amendments to the Sewer Use Regulation be enacted and codified appropriately within said Regulation. **AND FURTHER** that should any part of said amendment be found unenforceable by a Court of competent jurisdiction, that the remainder of the amendment shall retain its full force and effect.

The above Resolution, upon motion duly made, was passed and approved by the Board of Commissioners of the Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority at their regular meeting held on May 5, 2008.
